We live in a time when we are constantly surveilled. There are surveillance cameras in strategic places, we have the FRA who are surveilling our correspondence. Whenever something of interest happens, there are several cellphone cameras documenting and a number of them also publish on different sites. If you do not find an angle of your own, feel free to choose from the following list:

- Should more public places be surveilled?
- Is it a good idea to enter a TV show like Big Brother?
- Is the FRA surveillance good or bad?
- Should we ban cellphones from schools?
- Should cellphones be allowed on all lessons?
- Should we avoid shopping and paying over the internet?
- Is it a good idea to be very personal on social media?
- Many people choose to document an accident or an assault. Is that OK?
- Some papers pay good money for footage from e g accidents. Is that OK?

If you are interested in a higher grade on this task, you are not allowed to use key words. You get to use one lesson, and the rest of your preparation is to be considered as homework.
